


Miniature Horses in Ontario

What Does the MHCO Offer?



The Miniature Horse is rapidly gaining popularity throughout North America. This breed of horse is intended to be a scaled down replica of a full size horse.

Due to its small stature, the Miniature horse is easier for a first-time equine owner, a child, the disabled or someone who simply isn't able to work with full size horses anymore. They require less feed and less grazing acreage and therefore can be less expensive to keep than their full size counterparts.

Whether it is in the show ring, taking you for a buggy ride or just grazing at home, the Miniature Horse is winning hearts all over the world.

Club Objectives:

- 1. To gather or make available any information about Miniature Horses to all members and to anyone at large, to the best of the club's abilities.
- 2. To encourage an ongoing improvement in the quality of Miniature Horse stock through proper breeding programs and quality bloodline introduction.
- 3. To promote the appreciation and understanding of the Miniature as an ideal family horse, while maintaining the tradition of the breed.
- 4. To provide opportunities for members to utilize their Miniatures in various forms of recreation, be it shows, classes, events or family enjoyment.
- 5. To encourage fellowship among the members by arranging social events and activities throughout the membership year.
- 6. The club shall be operated without the purpose of financial gain to any of the members, and any surplus or accretions of the club shall be solely used for the purposes of the club and for the promotion of its objectives.



For the Show Ring:

1. The MHCO recognizes two height division for the show ring:
Section A: Horses 34" and under
Section B: Horses over 34" but not over 38".
2. All MHCO Miniature Horse shows are open to both A and B division horses that are registered with any recognized Miniature Horse Registry.
